Visits to public hospital patients

All visitors must complete a visitor screening before entering the hospital.

Visiting hours vary between hospitals so you should check with the hospital you are visiting before you visit.

There are limits on the number of visitors a patient can have. Most wards and areas only allow one visitor at a time.

Visits to aged care residents

Only people who have spent time in low-risk areas are permitted to visit aged care residents. If you have recently been in a high or medium-risk area you can not visit.

A maximum of two people can visit a resident at a time, staying as long as they wish (subject to the facility's own policies).

Multiple visits each day are allowed and there are no age limits on visitors.

Visitors must have an up-to-date flu vaccine and will be screened before entry.

Do not visit if you:



Have been in either a medium or high-risk area or premises in the last 14 days. Understand more about the risk levels at: www.coronavirus.tas.gov.au/comingtotas



Are displaying cold or flu like symptoms or have a temperature higher than 37.5 degrees



Have had contact within the past 14 days with a person diagnosed with COVID-19, or reasonably suspected of having COVID-19
